





COST OF LIVING

During your time here you will be responsible for living costs such as accommodation, food, clothing, transport, entertainment, and incidental expenses like books, equipment required for your studies, internet and sporting memberships.

Before granting a student visa, the Australian Government department of Immigration and Border Protection will require you to show or declare that you have enough funds to pay for your expenses while in Australia, and you are covered by overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) insurance.

The job roles that relate to this qualification may also include RTO Manager and RTO Director. Students who complete this course may wish to continue their education into a range of higher education qualifications in organisational learning and development.

A certified copy is a copy of the original document signed and dated by the organisation that issued the original document, a government official, Public Notary or Justice of the Peace, confirming that they have sighted the original.

If you are unable to apply online, the Whitehouse International college will also accept submission of a paper-based application form. Once your appllication has been received we will contact you to help you through the process.

- An authorised officer of an Australian diplomatic mission

Please note: if your documents are not in English you will need to provide certified English tranlations.




